Open Forum on the Budget

About fifty Skyline people gathered for yesterday's Open Forum on the budget. The forum was videotaped and the video will be available on our website later today at <http://www.smccd.edu/itunesu/>. I recommend that everyone view it to get a more detailed understanding of our current challenges and steps being taken. Kathy Blackwood, district Chief Financial Officer, and Jim Keller, Executive Vice Chancellor, provided an update on the state budget and its projected severe impact on our district under every scenario, including a threat to the district's ability to move into basic aid status. Ray Hernandez and Eloisa Briones, Co-Chairs of our College Budget Committee (CBC), reviewed the work the CBC has been doing to address the budget challenges, including the assumptions guiding their work, the array of cost cutting and revenue generating strategies being employed, and the multi-level approach to potential budget reductions, depending on the depth of the cuts required. Harry Joel, Vice Chancellor for Human Resources, reviewed the plans and timing for managed hiring. I reviewed the various ways that people can share their ideas, including talking with CBC members, supervisors, and using the Budget eSuggestion Box (the link is at the bottom of *Skyline Shines* every week). The Governor's May Revise will be published on May 28, after the May 19 special election. The CBC will meet again next week to continue its work and identify the best ways to communicate and keep everyone informed over the summer. It is clear from all of the information we have that our district and our college will need to make some profound changes to adapt to these new budgetary constraints and still do the very best job possible of serving our community.

Skyline Baseball and Badminton end season on high note

Skyline College finished up the spring sports season this past weekend as the Trojans Baseball team was knocked out of the playoffs and Women's Badminton finished the state championships. In baseball, Skyline lost their best of three series against Cosumnes River College two games to one. In the opener, on Friday, May 8th, the Trojans jumped out to an early 1-0 lead, but the Hawks answered with 6 runs in the 4th inning in route to a 7-3 victory. On Saturday morning May 9th, behind the strong pitching performance of Marcus Pointer, Skyline defeated Cosumnes River 6-2 forcing a decisive third game later that day. In the finale, Skyline jumped out to a 1-0 lead after 5 innings on the no-hit pitching performance of Ben Ruder. Cosumnes rallied against the bull-pen to gain a 2-1 advantage before the Trojans rallied to tie the game at 2-2. Unfortunately, the Hawks in their final at-bat, were able to string three consecutive hits together forcing across the winning run. Skyline finished the season 26-17. Congratulations to Coach Dino Nomicos, his staff and all the members of the team. In Women's Badminton, Skyline had a doubles team and individual reach the quarterfinals. In singles, Nour Abudamous from Skyline advanced through two rounds before losing in the quarterfinals to the eventual state runner-up Shannon Hsu of Irvine Valley College. In doubles, the team of Abudamous and Rachele Berania from Skyline won their first match before losing a quarterfinal battle to the team of Hsu and Vimla Phongasvi of Irvine Valley College. Hsu and Phongasvi would eventually be crowned state champions in doubles play. Skyline finished the season 6-2. Congratulations to Coach Jan Fosberg, her staff and all the members of the team. The

Institutional Planning Committee (IPC) update

After a brief review of the current budget situation and the near-year-end FTES/Productivity report, the group launched into an investigation of the SMCCD District Segmentation. Highlights included the observation that 41% of SMCCD students in Fall 2008 were taking one course, with another 18% taking 2+ courses with at least one pre-transfer Math, English, or ESL course. Follow-up questions were generated to shed further light on the range of student segments and how we might better serve them. The group also discussed the recent debate and developments on the statewide proposal to remove the research requirement to establishing prerequisites in cross-disciplinary courses (e.g. an English prerequisite for a History course). As the statewide proposals evolve and reach resolution, IPC will monitor any changes and their implications on our students. Finally, the group briefly reviewed the Year-end Goals & Unit Planning processes, and will take up the more thorough and scheduled three-year review of this process in 2009-10.
