The “Books Change Lives” drawing invited students, faculty, and staff to name a book that inspired, influenced, or changed their lives, and was part of the National Library Week celebration (April 12-16) at Skyline. Skyline students, faculty, and staff submitted a total of 54 fiction and non-fiction book titles for the library's drawing. Fiction titles ranged from Conrad's *Heart of Darkness* to Dr. Seuss's *Hop on Pop*, while non-fiction titles ranged from *Voyage of the Turtle* to *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens*. Some titles garnered several entries. For example, *Ender's Game*, by Orson Scott Card, was submitted by 3 different readers. A Skyline student – who entered Ken Kesey's *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest* -- won the random drawing on April 16. 2010 Skyline College Classified Staff Retreat

On April 22 - 23, 21 classified staff members representing 18 different departments attended the "Spreading Sunshine: Keeping Our Spirits Up" Classified Staff Retreat at Burlingame's beautiful Mercy Center. On the first day, Phyllis Taylor (We are a Symphony) challenged how we perceive ourselves and others. Karen Nielson (Taking Care of Your Hands) spoke about proper techniques for taking care of our hands. College Council update

- 1. District Shared Governance Committee update:** Denisse Gonzalez, Associated Students President, reported that the main items of discussion were on Board Rules and Regulations 3.10, 7.26, 6.24 and 6.425, which are to be brought back to constituencies
- 2. Budget update:** Regina Stanback Stroud, Vice President for Instruction, reported that Kathy Blackwood, district Chief Financial Officer, is scheduled to attend the next College Budget Committee (CBC) meeting to present the Resource Allocation Model and the tentative site allocations for 2010-11. Lori Adrian, Vice President for Student Services, also added that new information from Scott Lay, President of the Community College League of California, is that the Governor has said that he will veto any proposals that would further cut funds to higher education.
- 3. Accreditation midterm report update:** Regina reminded everyone members of the college have until Friday, April 30 to submit revisions to the draft Midterm report. The draft was distributed college wide by Donna Bestock and Ray Hernandez, Accreditation Self-Study Co-Chairs. The final report will be submitted to the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges in early fall semester.
- 4. Classified Retreat:** Kathy Fitzpatrick reported that 23 people attended. The Mercy Center was a great venue for the event. Kathy shared that it was nice to learn about what people do outside from work. The focus was on teamwork and keeping up morale. The idea of creating or implementing a project that could help out co-workers, help one another, has been brought up in Classified Council.

5. **Student elections:** Denisse reported that they will be held next week on Tuesday, May 4th. The General Assembly is in Los Angeles this weekend. Elections for Skyline and CSM are the on the same day.
6. **Academic Senate elections:** Fermin Irigoyen, current Vice President, reported that he and Sandra Hsu are the candidates for President. There are no candidates so far for vice president, secretary or treasurer. Ray Hernandez is running for District Academic Senate President.
7. **Student Recognition and Award Ceremony:** Lori reported that it will be held on Thursday, May 13th, from 4-6 pm. Commencement is on Friday, May 28th at 5pm. Lori also announced that Skyline student Stephanie Nale was chosen for the prestigious Pister Scholarship.
8. **Next meeting:** May 26. On that day the Council will make the selection of the Skyline Shines Award winner in the employee category.

College Budget Committee (CBC) update

The College Budget Committee met on April 26, co-chaired by Academic Senate President Ray Hernandez and Director of Business Services Eloisa Briones.

1. **2010-2011 Tentative Site Allocation:** District Chief Financial Officer Kathy Blackwood gave the CBC a brief state budget update announcing that April income tax receipts are coming in less than projected. The Governor's May Revise is coming up and districts are required to approve a tentative budget in June. Kathy proceeded to go through the assumptions underlying the district's Resource Allocation Model, including a 4% deficit factor in anticipation of a state deficit factor and/or midyear cuts, a student fee increase and no workload reduction. The earlier version of the resource allocation assumed a 3.4% workload reduction. 2010-2011 FTES goals were calculated based on 2008-09 actuals instead of 2009-10 goals. Chancellor's Council will need to determine the size of each college in terms of FTES. The elimination of the workload reduction resulted in an increase in the site allocations. In addition, the sites received redevelopment funds as approved by the board. At the next meeting the CBC will review updated cost projections for next year in relation to the revised allocation.
2. **District Committee on Budget & Finance (DCBF) report:** Linda Whitten and Barbara Lamson reported on presentation made by Arlene Calibo, Administrative Analyst, and Jose Nunez, Vice Chancellor of Facilities Planning and Operations during DCBF's April 20th meeting. Their report compared the square footage covered by each district engineer, custodian and groundskeeper versus the statewide average. The striking difference between these numbers highlights the need for more staffing support for this department.
