# CSU GENERAL EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS 179

Candidates for a Bachelor's degree from the CSU System who begin college in the Fall of 2005 shall complete the following pattern of general education courses encompassing a minimum of 48 semester units. # 180 INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM (IGETC)

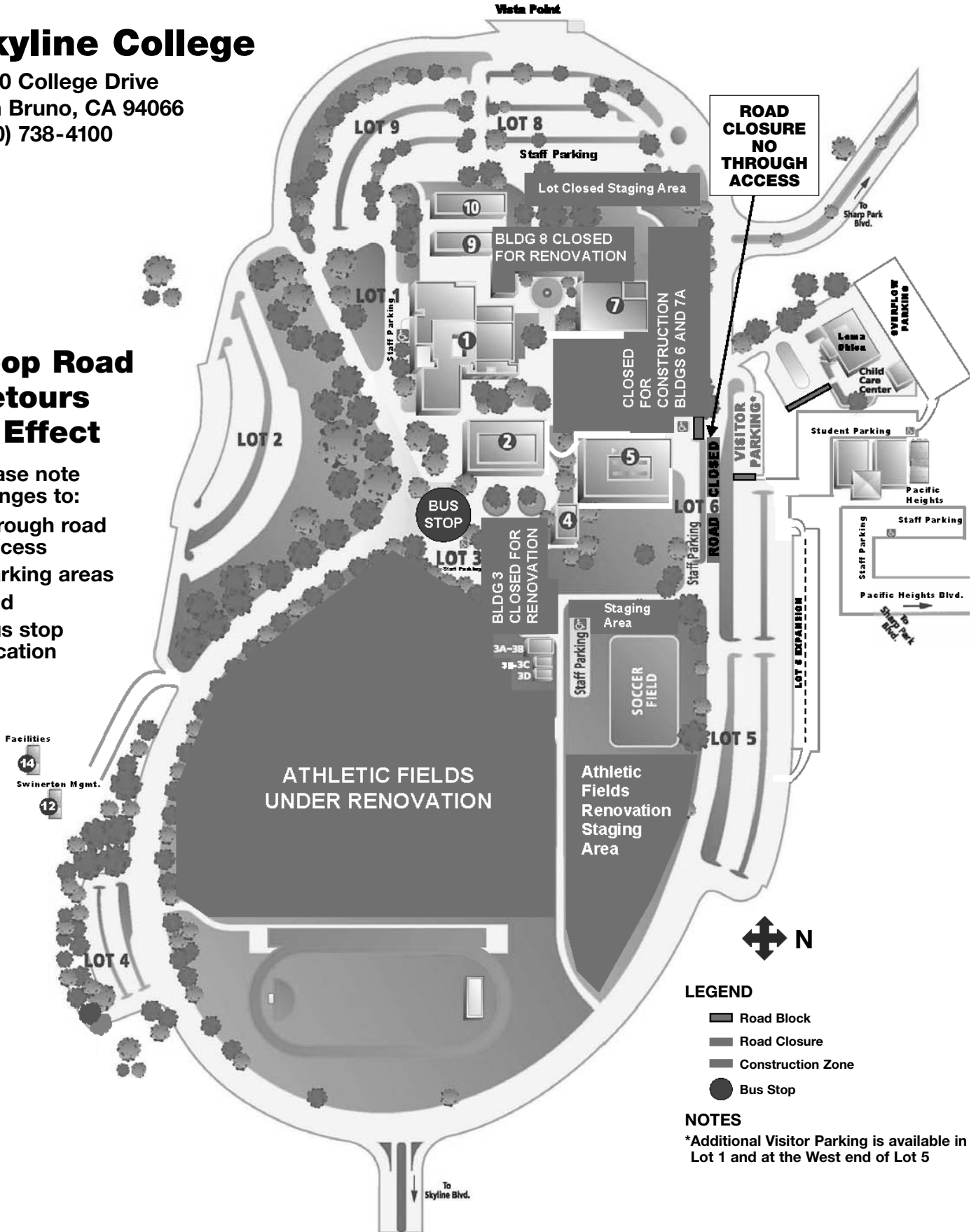
